My punk-influenced day-glo aesthetic uses intense neon colours, and displays my absurdist sense of humour, which references the dada movement.

My images are very much about repurposing old photographs into something new that inspires the imagination, makes you see them in a new light, or, at least amuses ... They speak of my longing for romantic connections and were very much inspired by lonely lockdown walks along the beaches at Branksome and Sandbanks, and Poole Harbour, or solo cycling through the abandoned streets during lockdown where I had only my imagination for company. My lonely outings became mini-adventures where I explored and looked and sometimes photographed the things I encountered, and then returning to my lockdown isolation I'd create art inspired by the things I'd seen, but with an added flight of fantasy.






